Durban Central Experience



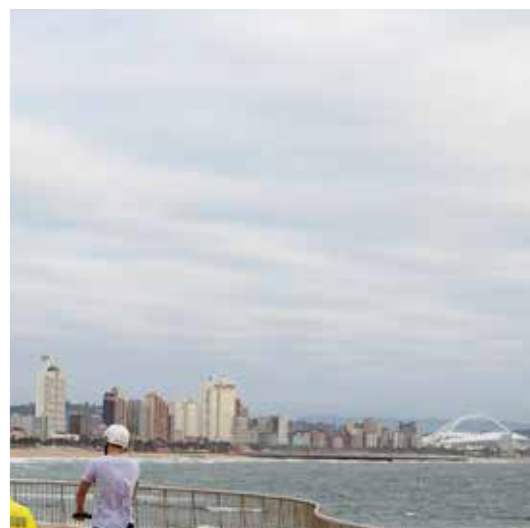

Art and architecture



Visually, Durban is a captivating city thanks to its heady mix of Victorian, Edwardian, Art Deco, Indian Traditional and modern architecture. The influences of Asian, African, English Colonial and Afrikaans cultures have all produced some rare and unique styles, making Durban's architecture astonishing in its quality and diversity. It is also a city that is rich in art- African, classical and modern.

A city tour will take in Durban's gorgeous Golden Mile, the City Hall and the Natural Science Museum, not to mention the numerous art galleries such as the Durban Art Gallery, the BAT Centre and the African Art Centre.

Founded in 1887, the Natural Science Museum is one of South Africa's smallest but busiest and most interesting

museums. Set in the City all building, the museum is renowned for its realistic habitat displays, life-size model of a Tyrannosaurus Rex, a near-complete Dodo skeleton and Egyptian mummy, Peten Amen" (remove the mention of the mummy as it was or is due to be sent back to Egypt.



A Rich Cultural Heritage

One of Durban's most unique features is the cultural mix of its people who have come from all corners of the globe.

The Nguni people migrated from Central and East Africa many centuries ago and settled in what is now KwaZulu-Natal where they herded cattle and hunted wild game. King Shaka was instrumental in unifying different tribes and the Zulu nation was born. The colonial era began in the early 1800s with the arrival of British settlers, followed by Boers from the Cape, originally from Europe. In the 1860s Indian indentured labourers were brought in from British India to work the sugar plantations. They were followed by traders, merchants and religious leaders from the East, which resulted in the establishment of a large and diverse Indian population. The result is a cultural mix of Eastern, Western

and African influences that are visible everywhere, in the art and architecture, fashion, cuisine and language.

Because of the religious and cultural diversity, many fascinating festivals and celebrations are held in and around the city throughout the year. Hindu temples hold annual fire-walking ceremonies, and in April the Durban beachfront comes alive with masses of devotees celebrating the Hare Krishna Festival of Chariots. On weekends Zionists gather at various sacred spots around the city in their flowing white robes. They also hold baptising ceremonies at the beachfront.



The Jumma Musjid

The sound of the muezzin calling the faithful to prayer echoes across downtown Durban from the Jumma Musjid, also known as the Grey Street Mosque. This magnificent mosque is the largest in the Southern Hemisphere and a central landmark in Durban's Indian district.

Architectural Marvel: Built in 1881 and expanded over the years, the mosque features a unique blend of Islamic decorations and Union period vernacular style. Its gilt-domed minarets tower over the bustling commercial area, while inside, the marbled worship hall offers a peaceful and elegant retreat.

Cultural Hub: Surrounding the mosque, you'll find a vibrant community with Indian food outlets offering local delicacies like the famous 'bunny chow'. The nearby Madressa Arcade bazaar and Victoria Street Market add to the cultural richness of the area.

Historical Significance: The mosque has been a cornerstone of the Muslim community in Durban for over a century, reflecting the city's diverse cultural and religious heritage.

Jumma Musjid – A Beacon of Faith and Culture in Durban!

Brave the Muti Market

Explore Durban's fascinating 'Muti' (traditional medicine) Market in the city centre for a unique insight into traditional African medicine and healing practices. Wander through the market and witness the preparation and sale of various traditional medicines.

Art galleries for Africa

Durban is home to many art galleries that exhibit a mixture of contemporary, classic and traditional arts and crafts, including the work of celebrated South African artists.

KwaMuhle Museum

Once the office of the notorious Department of Native Affairs, the KwaMuhle Museum provides a vital link with the city's apartheid past with its powerful displays. Learn about the history of Cato Manor, which has been restored and upgraded to cater for previously marginalised communities.

Victoria Street Market

This vibrant Indian Market with its colourful stalls, fish market and curio outlets is a favourite for tourists.

Durban is a shopper's paradise and offers many different shopping experiences. Street markets in and around the city offer a variety of crafts and beadwork. The Indian district in downtown Durban offers a huge selection of goods from the East as well as spices and curry powders. The Umhlanga Coast stretches for miles north of the city, framed by fields of green sugar cane and the endless golden beaches that this part of the world is so famous for.

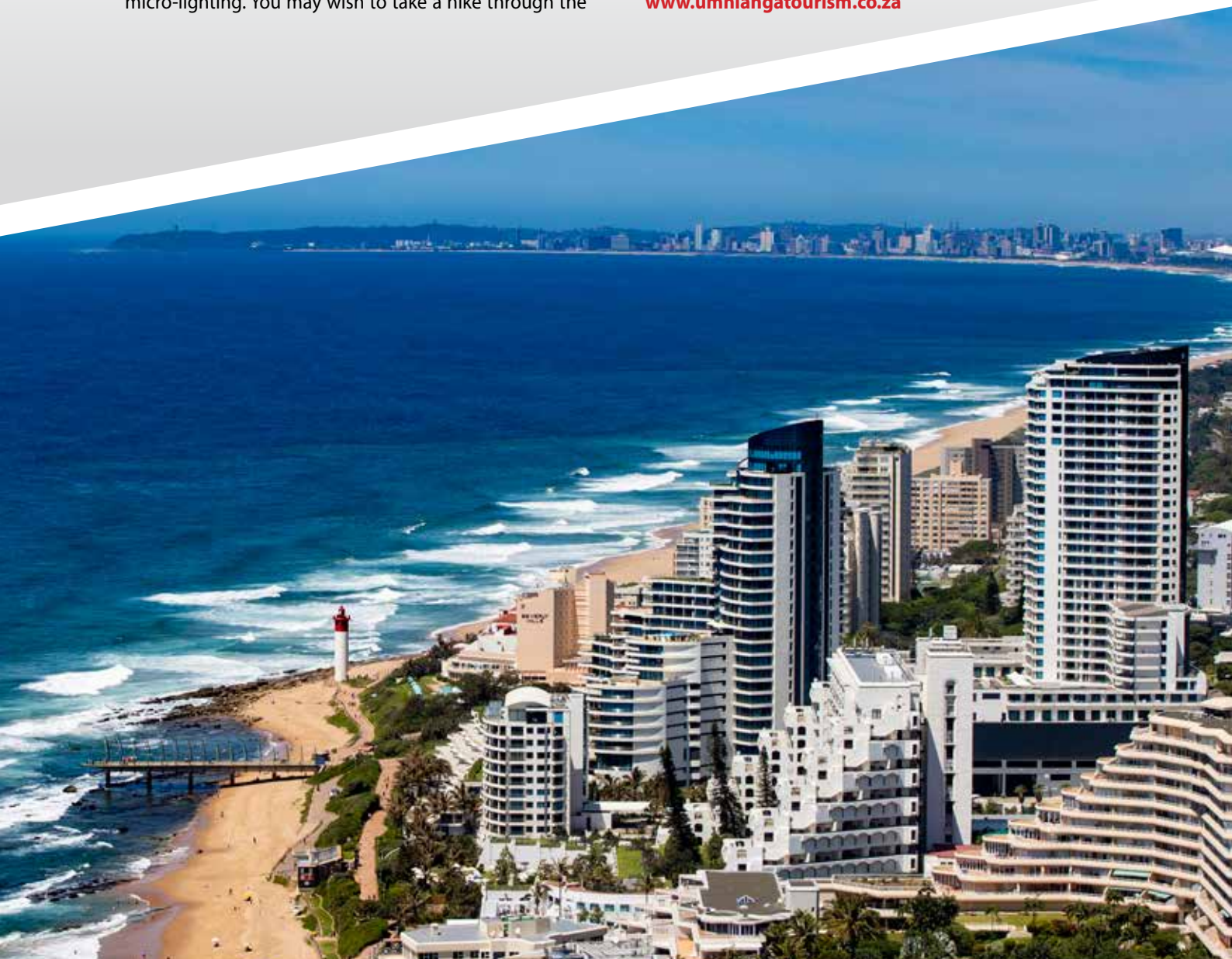

Microlighting over Durban and the surrounding coastline offers a beautiful and unique view of the area, and the opportunity to spot whales, dolphins and giant rays cruising the deep water.

Marianhill Monastery

Mariannhill Monastery is a haven of tranquility. The people who live and work here are friendly, and enjoy talking about the place. They don't have to follow the Trappist dictum that conversations should be entered into only when necessary.

Missionary work in Africa was impossible without communication, so Pope Pius X signed a decree that separated the missionaries at Mariannhill from the Trappist Order but they remained part of the rest of the tradition.

The monastery was founded by a hard working monk called Francis Pfanner. He bought a farm called Zeekoeigat (Hippopotamus Pool) in 1882. Pfanner coaxed the local chief, Manzini, to bring 300 families to live around the monastery and form a congregation. There, the local children were given elementary schooling in the mornings, and practical courses in agriculture in the afternoons. They were also taught skills such as printing, carpentry, blacksmithing and tailoring and the mission soon became self-supporting.

Dolphins and whales

The warm water of the Indian Ocean that wash Durban's shores are alive with marine life. Schools of bottlenose dolphin move up and down the coast all year round, and whales can be seen off the coast from July through to November - mainly humpback whales and occasionally southern rights. You can view these creature from high points along the coast, or even from the beach as the dolphins frequently frolic in the waves or just behind backline.

A number of dolphin and whale watching businesses have sprung up along the coast, offering ski-boat trips to view these gentle creatures close-up. Deep-sea fishing charters also ply these waters, launching from Umhlanga, Tongaat, Umdloti, Umkomaas and Durban. Pleasure cruises are also offered around the harbour and out to sea, with spectacular views of the city and the coastline.

Creatures of the deep

There are a variety of shark species found off the shores of Durban and adjacent coast. Most common is the ragged-tooth shark which is especially plentiful at Aliwal Shoal, which has become famous among divers world-wide for sightings of this shy creature. For those whose interest in sharks is more intellectual, the KwaZulu-Natal Sharks Board in Umhlanga is an informative and interesting visit. Visitors have the opportunity to learn about the biology, ecology and conservation of sharks, and view a 20-minute shark dissection.

The KwaZulu-Natal Sharks Board maintain shark nets along Durban's bathing beaches to ensure the safety of water users.



The Sapphire Coast



The town of Amanzimtoti (meaning 'sweet waters' in Zulu) is said to have been named by the great Zulu King Shaka after tasting the fresh water that flows out of the hills at this scenic spot. It is situated on the coast a short drive south of Durban.

This part of the coast is a popular destination for scuba divers who come to explore Aliwal Shoal, a fossilised sand dune that lies 5km off Umkomaas river mouth. A myriad of warm water reef fish and cold water fish converge on Aliwal Shoal to create a kaleidoscope of colour. For those who prefer to remain on terra firma, the beaches of the Sapphire Coast provide plenty of opportunities to enjoy swimming, surfing or fishing.

Nature lovers can explore the Amanzimtoti Bird Sanctuary or stroll in one of the nature reserves. Visit Crocworld and get up close and personal with a giant pre-historic crocodile! Crocworld has an excellent

restaurant and offers a complete wildlife experience. For a taste of local history or culture, there are a number of arts and craft stores offering a selection of handmade goods, and the Adams Mission College, founded in 1884. Mnini Dam is a great spot for water sport such as bass fishing, fly fishing, boating and canoeing. The dam is excellent for family outings, with shaded picnic spots, thatched gazebos and braai facilities making it a relaxing outdoor experience, now with an exquisite pub and grill.

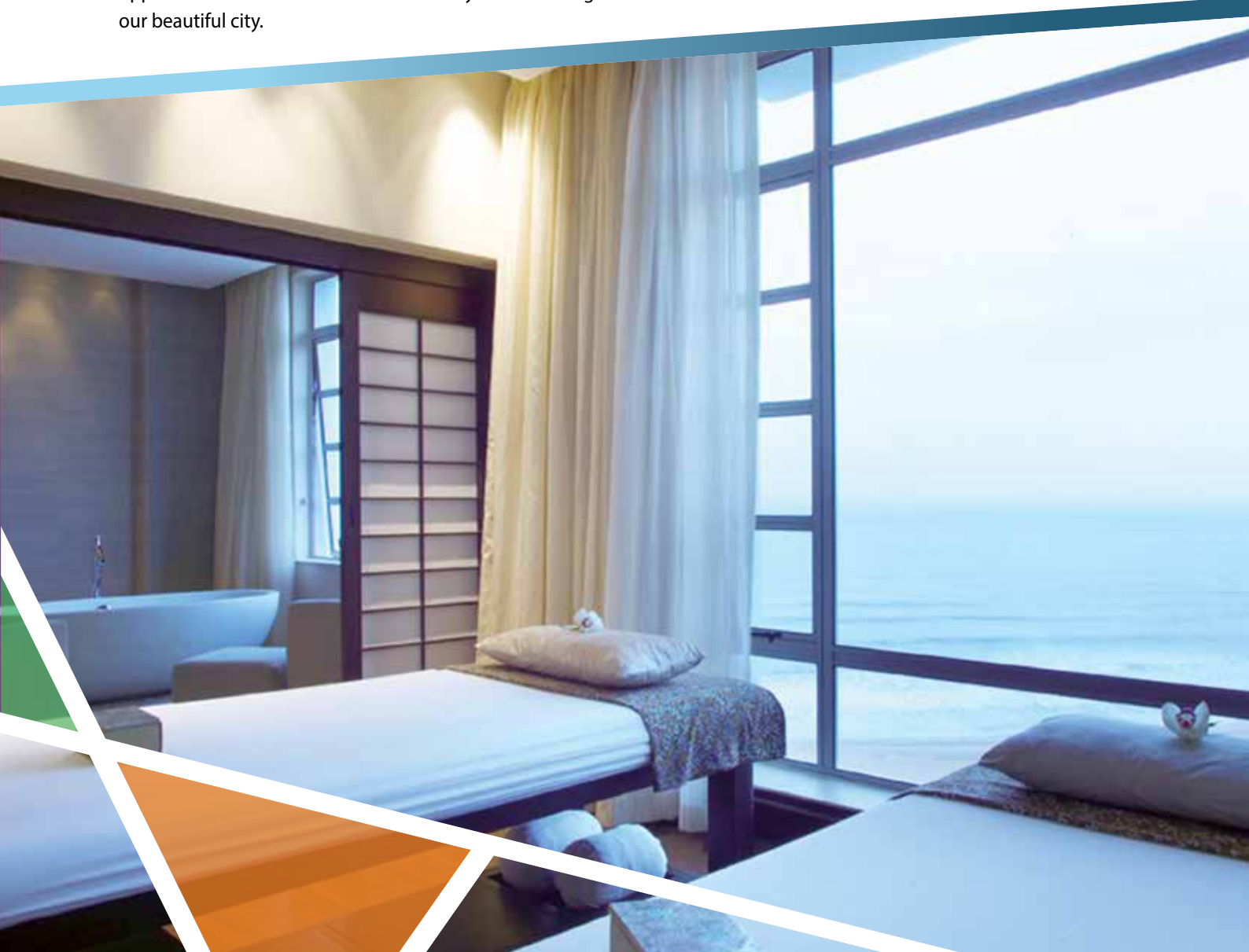

Dive boats launch from the Umkomaas River, south of Amanzimtoti, to get to the reef which is about 4km long and lies some 5km offshore, with depths ranging from 5m to 35m. The reef runs almost parallel to the shoreline and its many gullies, overhangs, caves and shelves are home to a vast array of marine life. Two wrecks lying near the shoal – the Produce and Nebo – provide divers with alternative underwater experiences.

Local dive operators provide equipment and accredited training, and will introduce you to the wonders that lie beneath the waves.





Stunning Natural Beauty

Durban is situated in an exquisite natural environment, and the warm, subtropical climate provides an ideal opportunity to explore nature. It has a variety of unique habitats, from dense coastal forest, to mangrove swamps and estuarine systems which are home to a wondrous variety of plant, animal and bird life.

The Umgeni River Bird Park is home to endangered, indigenous and exotic birds in a stunning natural environment on the banks of the uMngeni River. Silverglen Nature Reserve

The use of muthi (Zulu traditional medicine) is deeply rooted in Zulu culture. A vast number of plant species are used to make muthi preparations, and as a result of over-exploitation and shrinking habitats, some muthi plants have been driven to the brink of extinction.

To help save these plants growing in the wild, the Silverglen Nature Reserve has established a nursery which propagates muthi plants using indigenous knowledge. The nursery cultivates about 120 at-risk plant species and plays a vital role in conserving Durban's natural flora.

Beachwood Mangroves Nature Reserve

Situated on the edge of the city between the north bank of the uMngeni River and the south bank of the Tongaat River, Beachwood Mangroves Nature Reserve is home to a unique mangrove ecosystem which is as interesting as it is beautiful.

A haven for many rare bird species and thousands of fiddler crabs, these mangroves are an important part of Durban's natural heritage.

Inanda Dam

This spot has become legendary as the compulsory second overnight stop on the Dusi Canoe Marathon, a thrilling sporting fixture with a long history.

Airport shuttle

Time zones

South Africa's electricity supply runs at 220/230V, 50Hz AC. Sockets take round-pinned plugs. Most hotel rooms have sockets that will take 110V electric shavers, but for other appliances visitors might need adaptors.

Emergencies

The city has a number of excellent medical facilities, able to meet any medical emergency. You are advised to take out travel insurance to cover medical costs.

Malaria

Durban and most of KZN is malaria-free. However, it is recommended that visitors to the far northern game reserves consult their medical practitioners.

Internet

There are numerous internet cafés around the city, and most of the big hotels and public buildings have wireless internet hotspots.

Language

English and Zulu are the main languages spoken in Durban, however most inhabitants understand and can communicate in basic English.

Money matters

- South Africa uses the Rand (R) as its currency unit. Foreign currency may be exchanged at any commercial bank or foreign exchange bureau.
- Banking hours: Monday to Friday, 09h00-15h30; Saturday, 09h00-11h00.
- Outside banking hours, some hotels will change money, although this entails a fairly hefty commission. You can also change money at branches of American Express and Rennie's Travel.
- ATMs are widespread and will accept most international bank & credit cards.
- Credit cards, including American Express, Visa, Diners Club and MasterCard, may be used at most hotels, restaurants, car hire companies etc.

Telecommunications

- Mobile phones: The country is well covered by all networks.
- You can use a GSM/tri-band phone in South Africa, if you arranged for international roaming before leaving home.
- International telephone dialling code is +27.
