

t is a centre of world-class sport and hosts major international events. It is a shoppers' paradise with sophisticated shopping malls and precincts, craft markets and street bazaars. It is an entertainment and hospitality centre offering a wide range of accommodation from swish beachfront hotels to themed guesthouses, self-catering apartments and homely B&Bs. It is also a bustling commercial and manufacturing centre connected to the business capitals of the world, and is built around one of the busiest ports in Africa.

Durban's people are friendly and laid-back, and reflect a rich cultural diversity that includes African, Eastern and Western influences.

There is an abundance of breathtaking scenery just beyond the city. To the north lies the bustling coastal town of Umhlanga, packed with hotels, restaurants and beautiful beaches. To the south is the Sapphire Coast, an endless stretch of sub-tropical paradise dotted with holiday towns. To the west lies the verdant Valley of 1000 Hills with its nature reserves and cultural villages. A little further afield, the Big 5 game reserves are just a few hours' drive away, while to the west the mighty uKhahlamba Drakensberg Park - a World Heritage Site- beckons.



he Durban city centre is a bustling business and entertainment hub situated around a busy harbour. The best way to enjoy views of the harbour and city skyline are to take a harbour cruise or eat at one of the waterfront restaurants at Wilson's Wharf.

A mile of golden beaches on the eastern edge of the city extend from the exciting uShaka Marine World near the harbour entrance all the way to the Suncoast Casino, Hotels & Entertainment World with its restaurants, cinemas and gaming halls. There are many hotels, restaurants and bars dotted along this strip to keep you entertained







Durban's ocean playground

Durban is one of the few cities in the world that offers world-class surfing waves right on its doorstep. Epic 'beach break' surf conditions can be found along the entire Durban beachfront, particularly at New Pier, North Beach and Battery Beach. For more experienced surfers, the Bluff and North Coast offers powerful reef breaks, and the South Coast is home to some world-class point breaks.

Other ocean activities that can be enjoyed are swimming, fishing, jetskiing, snorkelling, canoeing, windsurfing and kite surfing. Durban's mild all-year-round climate and 19°C-24°C water temperature make it a summer AND winter holiday destination.

Munch a 'bunny chow'

The bunny chow, a hollowed out loaf of bread filled with curry, is Durban's most famous culinary invention, and no visit to the city is complete without sampling one. They're sold at almost every corner cafe and take-away.





The captivating uShaka Marine World

At the end of Durban's Golden Mile is Africa's largest marine theme park. uShaka Marine World incorporates fresh and sea water, lush vegetation, and the recreation of a 1920's cargo shipwreck into a magical world of sea and marine life.

No matter what the occasion, you will always find something to do at uShaka Marine World, from dining at restaurants on the ocean's edge to the unforgettable shopping experience at uShaka Village Walk.

For the adventurous there are world-class dolphin shows and adrenalin pumping water-slides, including the highest slide in Africa. After all the action, you can spend a lazy afternoon sunbathing on uShaka beach or sipping sundowners at Moyo cafe, on the uShaka Marine pier.

Eating out

Durban is renowned for its diverse cuisine from all over the world, but especially for its spicy Indian curries, fish dishes and exotic meat dishes like venison, crocodile and ostrich. The following areas are some of the city's best eating and entertainment zones.

Wilson's Wharf

Wilson's Wharf is one of Durban's liveliest venues offering a fusion of food, live music and shopping overlooking the Durban harbour.

Florida Road, Morningside

For a trendy and cosmopolitan eating and social experience, visit Florida Road where cafes and restaurants line the sidewalks amidst buzzing art galleries and boutique shops.

Helen Joseph (Davenport) Road, Glenwood

Take a walk up this leafy suburban road and choose from a range of restaurants serving Moroccan or Portuguese cuisine, or gourmet pizza and pastas. The coffee is always fresh.

Sundowner Harbour Cruise

For a unique eating and entertainment experience, book a trip on one of the many charter boats that offers day, sunset, or night cruises around the harbour.



Nightlife

Party till dawn in the 'warmest place to be' and be sure to watch a magnificent sunrise over the warm Indian Ocean. Durban is famous for its Zulu and traditional music and is a hot-bed of musical talent, and live bands can be seen most nights of the week.

Theatres

Durban has a number of excellent theatres where local and touring productions put on top class shows. There are also a number of dinner theatres.

Clubs and bars

Durban people enjoy a fun night out, so there are many clubs and bars scattered around the city. Your best bet is to speak to the locals to find the best venues. Many of these are concentrated in certain districts, like Glenwood, Florida Road, the beachfront, Kloof, Hillcrest and Umhlanga. Most of the big hotels, malls and casinos have clubs and cocktail bars where the trendy folk hang out.




Art and architecture

Visually, Durban is a captivating city thanks to its heady mix of Victorian, Edwardian, Art Deco, Indian Traditional and modern architecture. The influences of Asian, African, English Colonial and Afrikaans cultures have all produced some rare and obscure styles, making Durban's architecture astonishing in its quality and diversity. It is also a city that is rich in art- both African, classical and modern.

city tour will take in Durban's gorgeous Golden Mile, the City Hall and the Natural Science Museum, not to mention the numerous art galleries such as the Durban Art Gallery, the BAT WCentre and the African Art Centre.

Founded in 1887, the Natural Science Museum is one of South Africa's smallest but busiest and most interesting museums. Set in the City Hall building, the museum is renowned for its realistic habitat displays, life-size model of a Tyrannosaurus Rex, a near-complete Dodo skeleton and Egyptian mummy, Peten Amen.



A Rich Cultural Heritage

One of Durban's most unique features is the cultural mix of its people who have come from all corners of the globe.

he Nguni people migrated from Central and East Africa many centuries ago and settled In what Is now KwaZulu-Natal where they herded cattle and hunted wild game. King Shaka was instrumental in unifying different tribes and the Zulu nation was born. The colonial era began in the early 1800s with the arrival of British settlers, followed by Boers from the Cape, originally from Europe. In the 1860s Indian indentured labourers were brought in from British India to work the sugar plantations. They were followed by traders, merchants and religious leaders from the East, which resulted in the establishment of a large and diverse Indian population. The result is a cultural mix of Eastern, Western

and African influences that are visible everywhere, in the art and architecture, fashion, cuisine and language.

Because of the religious and cultural diversity, many fascinating festivals and celebrations are held in and around the city throughout the year. Hindu temples hold annual fire-walking ceremonies, and in April the Durban beachfront comes alive with masses of devotees celebrating the Hare Krishna Festival of Chariots. On weekends Zionists gather at various sacred spots around the city In their flowing white robes. They also hold baptising ceremonies at the beachfront.

The Jumma Musjid

The sound of the muezzin calling the faithful to prayer echoes across downtown Durban from Jumma Musjid, one of several mosques dotted around the city.

Brave the Muti Market

Durban's 'Muti' (traditional medicine) Market, in the city centre allows an insight into the world of traditional African medicine and healing practices. VIsitors can make their way through the market and witness a variety of traditional medicine being made and prepared for sale. It is recommended you only visit the market with an accredited tour guide.

Art galleries for Africa

Durban Is home to many art galleries that exhibit a mixture

of contemporary, classic and traditional arts and crafts, including the work of celebrated South African artists.

KwaMuhle Museum

Once the office of the notorious Department of Native Affairs, the KwaMuhle Museum provides a vital link with the city's apartheid past with its powerful displays. Learn about the history of Cato Manor, which has been restored and upgraded to cater for previously marginalised communities.


Victoria Street Market

The Umhlanga Coast stretches for miles north of the city, framed by fields of green sugar cane and the endless golden beaches that this part of the world is so famous for.




Durban from above

There are many ways to enjoy Durban's unique scenery, and what better way to do it than from the air? A number of helicopter tour operators offer scenic flips, departing from Durban's Virginia Airport just north of the Umgeni River mouth.

Microlighting over Durban and the surrounding coastline offers a beautiful and unique view of the area, and the opportunity to spot whales, dolphins and giant rays cruising the deep water.

During the annual sardine run, microlighters can enjoy the sight of massive shoals of sardines being chased by dolphins and sharks, while the Valley of 1000 Hills is the venue for paragliding schools offering training and scenic flights.



Inanda Heritage Trail

The Inanda Heritage Trail allows a visit to some of Durban's most important historical sites, places where South Africa's future changed for the better because of the bravery of a few individuals. The Phoenix Settlement is where Mahatma Gandhi developed his philosophy of passive resistance, which has been lauded the world over, and his home has been turned into a monument dedicated to lasting peace and justice. At Inanda Township one can visit the Ohlange Institute, founded by the first president of the African National Congress, Rev. John Dube; this is also the site where Nelson Mandela cast his historic vote in South Africa's first democratic elections in 1994. The Inanda Seminary is one of the oldest and most famous schools for girls in South Africa and has a legacy of producing some of the country's finest black women leaders. Visits to those historic sites can be arranged through specialist tour operators.

Our weekly Farmers Market opens with the call of the rooster in the early, misty hours of the morning. Explore the roots of Zulu culture

Many local Zulu people have maintained a traditional lifestyle in the Umgeni and Shongweni Valleys, giving the area a powerful sense of history and identity. Their colourful ceremonies and expressive, artistic culture give this area its vibrant atmosphere and creative energy.

Explore the roots of Zulu culture by taking an organised tour deep into tribal lands. You can witness ancient Zulu ceremonies, as traditional diviners 'throw the bones' and communicate with their spiritual ancestors at pheZulu Safari Park. PheZulu also offers traditional Zulu dancing and cultural shows, as well as game drives, local curios, wonderful views across the valley and a crocodile and snake park. For those with adventurous taste buds and a carnivorous hunger, try out a crocodile steak at pheZulu's Croctilians Restaurant.

Krantzkloof Nature Reserve

Pack your hiking-shoes, your camera/binoculars, and pack a picnic basket, because you are in for adventure when visiting Krantzkloof Nature reserve. The Reserve is situated just outside of Kloof (4 kilometers to be exact). You can expect breathtaking views of the gorge, waterfall and hectares of dense forest and vegetation.




Marianhill Monastary

Mariannhill Monastery is a haven of tranquility. The people who live and work here are friendly, and enjoy talking about the place. They don't have to follow the Trappist dictum that conversations should be entered into only when necessary.

Missionary work in Africa was impossible without communication, so Pope Pius X signed a decree that separated the missionaries at Mariannhill from the Trappist Order but they remained part of the rest of the tradition.

The monastery was founded by a hard working monk called Francis Pfanner. He bought a farm called Zeekoeigat (Hippopotamus Pool) in 1882. Pfanner coaxed the local chief, Manzini, to bring 300 families to live around the monastery and form a congregation. There, the local children were given elementary schooling in the mornings, and practical courses in agriculture in the afternoons. They were also taught skills such as printing, carpentry, blacksmithing and tailoring and the mission soon became self-supporting.



It is currently used mostly for football matches and was selected as one of the 3 training venues of the 2010 FIFA World Cup after being renovated in 2010 and brought up to FIFA standards.















Sodurba Tourism

Sodurba Tourism is involved in accommodation, travel services, venues and conference organisers, historical and cultural centres, recreation and entertainment attractions, educational tourism services, conservation areas, restaurants, sports venues, clubs facilities and trails and security for South Durban, which encompasses the Bluff, Wentworth, Mobeni, Jacobs, Woodlands, Montclair, Yellowwood Park, Clairwood, the harbour, Isipingo, Prospecton, Merebank and Wilson's Wharf.

Dolphins and whales

The warm water of the Indian Ocean that wash Durban's shores are alive with marine life. Schools of bottlenose dolphin move up and down the coast all year round, and whales can be seen off the coast from July through to November - mainly humpback whales and occasionally southern rights. You can view these creature from high points along the coast, or even from the beach as the dolphins frequently frolic in the waves or just behind backline.

A number of dolphin and whale watching businesses have sprung up along the coast, offering ski-boat trips to view these gentle creatures close-up. Deep-sea fishing charters also ply these waters, launching from Umhlanga, Tongaat, Umdloti, Umkomaas and Durban. Pleasure cruises are also offered around the harbour and out to sea, with spectacular views of the city and the coastline.

Creatures of the deep

There are a variety of shark species found off the shores of Durban and adjacent coast. Most common is the ragged-tooth shark which is especially plentiful at Aliwal Shoal, which has become famous among divers world-wide for sightings of this shy creature. For those whose interest in sharks is more intellectual, the KwaZulu-Natal Sharks Board in Umhlanga is an informative and interesting visit. Visitors have the opportunity to learn about the biology, ecology and conservation of sharks, and view a 20-minute shark dissection.

The KwaZulu-Natal Sharks Board maintain shark nets along Durban's bathing beaches to ensure the safety of water users.

The Sapphire Coast

The town of Amanzimtoti (meaning 'sweet waters' in Zulu) is said to have been named by the great Zulu King Shaka after tasting the fresh water that flows out of the hills at this scenic spot. It is situated on the coast a short drive south of Durban.



his part of the coast is a popular destination for scuba divers who come to explore Aliwal Shoal, a fossilised sand dune that lies Skm off Umkomaas river mouth. A myriad of warm water reef fish and cold water fish converge on Aliwal Shoal to create a kaleidoscope of colour. For those who prefer to remain on terra firma, the beaches of the Sapphire Coast provide plenty of opportunities to enjoy swimming, surfing or fishing.

Nature lovers can explore the Amanzimtoti Bird Sanctuary or stroll in one of the nature reserves. Visit Crocworld and get up close and personal with a giant pre-historic crocodile! Crocworld has an excellent restaurant and offers a complete wildlife experience. For a taste of local history or culture, there are a number of arts and craft stores offering a selection of handmade goods, and the Adams Mission College, founded in 1884. Mnini Dam is a great spot for water sport such as bass fishing, fly fishing, boating and canoeing. The dam is excellent for family outings, with shaded picnic spots, thatched gazebos and braai facilities making it a relaxing outdoor experience, now with an exquisite pub and grill.







Silverglen Nature Reserve

The use of muthi (Zulu traditional medicine) is deeply rooted in Zulu culture. A vast number of plant species are used to make muthi preparations, and as a result of over-exploitation and shrinking habitats, some muthl plants have been driven to the brink of extinction.

To help save these plants growing in the wild, the Silverglen Nature Reserve has established a nursery which propagates muthi plants using indigenous knowledge. The nursery cultivates about 120 at-risk plant species and plays a vital role in conserving Durban's natural flora.

Beachwood Mangroves Nature Reserve

Situated on the edge of the city between the north bank of the uMngeni River and the south bank of the Tongaat River, Beachwood Mangroves Nature Reserve is home to a unique mangrove ecosystem which is as interesting as it is beautiful.

A haven for many rare bird species and thousands of fiddler crabs, these mangroves are an important part of Durban's natural heritage.

Inanda Dam

This spot has become legendary as the compulsory second overnight stop on the Dusi Canoe Marathon, a thrilling sporting fixture with a long history.





Registered metered taxis are clearly marked with a coloured stickers (see above), so that you can be assured of a safe and professional service.

Minibus taxis

Minibus taxis are hard to miss as they often have music pumping and someone hanging out of a window touting for passengers. Ask the locals for assistance when choosing a minibus taxi route.

King Shaka International Airport

Durban's new international airport is located north of Durban's city centre and offers international access to Durban, as well as domestic flights to all the major South African cities. Taxis, airport shuttles and car hire are available.

Inter-city bus companies

Durban is connected to the rest of the country by an excellent bus network, serviced by buses of international standards. The main bus station in Durban is close to the Sahara Kingsmead cricket stadium.

South Africa's electricity supply runs at 220/230V, 50Hz AC. Sockets take round-pinned plugs. Most hotel rooms have sockets that will take 110V electric shavers, but for other appliances visitors might need adaptors.

Emergencies

The city has a number of excellent medical facilities, able to meet any medical emergency. You are advised to take out travel insurance to cover medical costs.

Malaria

Durban and most of KZN is malaria-free. However, it is recommended that visitors to the far northern game reserves consult their medical practitioners.

English and Zulu are the main languages spoken in Durban, however most inhabitants understand and can communicate in basic English.

- Outside banking hours, some hotels will change money, although this entails a fairly hefty commission.
 You can also change money at branches of American Express and Rennies Travel.
- ATMs are widespread and will accept most international bank & credit cards.
- Credit cards, including American Express, Visa, Diners Club and MasterCard, may be used at most hotels, restaurants, car hire companies etc.




